The Apostle Paul poses two strange questions in I Corinthians 15:55: "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" They are strange, because anyone who has ever been around death, especially the death of a loved one, has felt the horrible loss and raw sting of death. As a pastor, I have witnessed this repeatedly. I have been there when tears were like waterfalls, when the question "why" boomed like thunder, and when grief was like a sleepless night that never ends. In some ways, we might wonder if the Apostle Paul has ever lost someone he loves.

As I write this, I'm staring at the names of twenty-one people whose funerals I led since All Saints' Sunday, November 6, 2016. That's a lot of "loss" and "sting" for one congregation. I think it's quite possible for someone to conclude that death has won more than a few victories. So, what in the world was Paul thinking when he asked these questions? Was he ignorant of the great loss and pain that people experience when a loved one dies? Was he insensitive to the sadness and hardship that people encounter at such times of grief? Or did Paul have something else in mind?

Mollie Mae Olson died December 3, 2016. She was 99 years old. She and Margaret Ellertson, who died later in December, were our last two living charter members. Mollie and I had several conversations in the weeks preceding her death. At first, when doctors told her that her heart was too weak and there was nothing they could do to strengthen it, she was not ready to simply give in and leave her life behind, especially her friends and family. I also think she was still interested in the idea of being 100, too. So, I remember telling her that she needn't be in a hurry to go to heaven.

Yet, after a few days of being in the hospital, Mollie started to feel weaker and less content. Her mind began to focus on heaven and Christ, and Lorando and Jerry, her husband and son. She had no doubts about heaven, and believed death was the gateway there. She became extremely curious about being with Jesus, and seeing Him face to face, not only through her faith. Plus, she wanted very much to be with Lorando and Jerry, whom she believed were waiting for her. In other words, Mollie was finally at peace with the end of her life here, and the beginning of her new life in Christ.

Perhaps through Mollie, we can understand why the Apostle Paul poses his two questions. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting? Indeed, to a person of faith like Mollie, death has no victory, because of the resurrection of Jesus and the promise of eternal life to all who believe in Him. Furthermore, now the sting of death is more like a kiss from Jesus, who caught Mollie when she fell in death, and who took her by the hand to lead her to God's heaven. So, Paul was neither ignorant, nor was he insensitive. He simply, like Mollie, had faith in Jesus Christ.

As we remember a year of 21 funerals, as we remember fondly those friends and family who have died, we do so with this same faith in the Lord. This faith gives us confidence that our Savior Jesus Christ not only forgives our sin and delivers us from evil, but He promises us and everyone who has faith in Him, heaven and eternal life. How can death be victorious when the tomb is empty, and the Lord Jesus is resurrected and alive? How can death be victorious when Jesus promises to prepare a place for us in heaven, and then one day to return to bring us there?



As Paul writes in I Corinthians 15:57: "Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through Jesus Christ." I invite you to live life and face death with such confidence. Then, as we light candles on All Saints' Sunday, November 5, we are indeed celebrating Jesus' victory over death, as well as His promises of heaven and eternal life to all who believe. At the same time, since our grief for those we love most is so difficult, even when we believe these promises, may our confidence in Jesus this All Saints' and beyond, be accompanied by great love, compassion, hugs, and prayers for each other.

Thank you for your extra gifts in September, as we had our first "in the black" month since last spring. We are current with all our bills, only because of our \$30,000 reserve fund. This fund, however, as you know, must be paid back.

We will not be having a fall stewardship emphasis this November. Instead, the church council has decided to do a special 4-week series after Christmas. Our theme will be, "A Walk with Jesus".
