My dad has had three surgeries in the month of March. The first was major back surgery, and the second two were necessary to resolve clotting issues my dad has had in his leg and back. He and mom have been to one doctor appointment after another between each of the surgeries, and I think it is fair to say that they are tired of medical facilities in general. As I reflect on all that my parents have been through, I am left with the following conclusion. There are few things like health scares that cause us to reexamine what is really important in life.

Whether the diagnosis is cancer, like my mom had nearly four decades ago, or clotting issues, like my dad is going through now, these moments where our health is questionable and our mortality is conspicuous, are opportunities to connect with loved ones. At the very least, they give us time to express the love we have for those people who have meant most to us in life. We aren't always so fortunate to have such opportunities, because sometimes health scares turn into death and funerals, and we wish we had said something more.

These moments are also opportunities for us to connect with God. I know I have been spending more time in prayer since my dad has been struggling with his health. In my opinion, there is nothing like prayer to bring us closer to the Lord. I think prayer connects us so closely to the Lord, our lips to His ear, that trusting the Lord with our lives and entrusting to the Lord the lives of our loved ones, becomes a lot simpler. However, it also strikes me that we ought not to wait until someone we love gets sick to connect with God.

As a matter of fact, Lent and Easter are perfect times to advance our relationship with the Lord. Lent in particular is a time where Christians are called to spend more time in worship, in personal prayer and devotion, and in reflection on what the death of Jesus on the cross means for us. What does it mean to have the creator of all things, including me, to love me so much that He is willing to sacrifice his very life, so that I am no longer a vassal of sin, death, and evil? Just like a favorite Lenten hymn says, "He took the fall, and thought of me, above all!"

To me the cross is the very moment where God most clearly says, "I love you!" and "I am here to help you!" With this in mind - that we are children of a God who loves us so much He is willing to die for us, we may confidently say our prayers. Whether they are prayers for ourselves, or prayers for loved ones who are struggling or sick, we know God is close at hand, listening to us and willing to help us. God is close at hand, ready to offer forgiveness and grace, strength and peace, healing and wholeness, love and life, even while we are still praying.

Pray for starving children and homeless refugees. Pray for strangers and enemies. Pray for unbelievers and those who need to hear the Gospel. "Pray constantly," as the Apostle Paul says in First Thessalonians 5:17. It is through such prayer that you enter into the very presence of the Lord who made you, who saves you, and yes, who raises you to new and eternal life.

Jesus on Parade

This worship service is a journey through Holy Week with words and music. We will retell the Passion story of Jesus from Palm Sunday through the Lord's burial with the help of lots of special music. Music will include vocal solos and groups, as well as an instrument or two. This is something new and you will not want to miss it!

Maundy Thursday

One Last Night

For ULC this has become a very traditional night. We very carefully work our way through the last night of Jesus' life. We will prepare a meal, wash some feet, learn a new commandment, share the Lord's Supper, and abandon Jesus as he is arrested. The service will be punctuated with drama, demonstration, hymns, special music, the Word, and First Communion for some of our fifth grade youth. Please join us as we walk with the Lord Jesus on his last night on earth before his crucifixion and death.





Good Friday

Day of the Cross

This is the most solemn day of the Christian year. It is the anniversary of the crucifixion of our Lord Jesus. He died on the cross to save us from sin, evil, and death, to save us in every possible way. On this night, we will tell the story of his death with the help of children, youth, and puppets. Light will diminish until darkness announces the death of Jesus, and we leave remembering *Jesus loves me this I know*.

Calling All Men Martin Luther




