In truth, perhaps the words should be, "ALL I NEED TODAY is whole lot of COFFEE & a whole lot of JESUS". I am not proud of this, but it is closer to my reality.

Yes, I love coffee, and darker and richer is better! Coffee is a guilty pleasure for me. A few years ago, when I was struggling with blood pressure issues, I went off caffeinated coffee for 3 months to see if that lowered my pressure. Naturally, I was delighted to learn that such coffee was having no effect on my blood pressure. So, as soon as my doctor gave me the thumbs up, I immediately went out to purchase the blends I enjoy most. I am telling you this because Dave's gift has caused me to wonder if I love coffee a little too much. Is coffee more important to me than Jesus?



Of course, I want to answer, "NO WAY!", but you should not let me off the hook so easy. This very day, before I said good morning to the Lord, I turned on my Keurig machine to brew my first cup. However, since I was thinking about writing this article, I became embarrassed, and sat down at the kitchen table to pray – to give the Lord a proper greeting, to thank him for the day, as well as to remember a few of you who are facing challenges at this time. By the time I said, "Amen", the Keurig was ready to brew my first cup, a delicious French roast, which I must admit I enjoyed very much.

By now you may be wondering in this season of Easter, what a cup of coffee, a delicious French roast blend, has to do with Jesus who we proclaim risen from the dead? Well, it has everything to do with keeping perspective. Why is it that I who believe in Jesus, who believe with all my being that he is risen, alive, and active in the world, would reach for a cup of coffee this morning even before I recognize his presence, his risen presence, in my life? Certainly, coffee provides me with a number of very tangible blessings, the amazing aroma and taste being first and foremost.

Yet the risen Lord Jesus, fully present and participating in my life, provides me with blessings beyond what coffee or any other earthly thing can muster. For example, can coffee offer forgiveness to me when I am broken because of something I have done wrong? Can coffee enter into my being to heal me and make me whole when I am suffering illness? Can coffee stand alongside of me when I am grieving the death of a loved one, and speak to me of eternal life?

I fully realize these are ridiculous questions. Of course, coffee or anything else on earth cannot provide for me, forgive me, heal me, help me, or love me, the way the risen Lord Jesus Christ does. That's what makes it all the more ridiculous that I reach for my coffee in the morning before I reach out for the Lord. Still, the Lord Jesus does not hold my love of coffee against me. He made coffee after all. I might even casually remind him that he's the one who made it so good! So, instead of judging me for my love of coffee, he carefully nudges me every morning to remind how much he loves me.

In this way, our relationship with the Lord Jesus begins anew each day. We may have many things on our minds, like that first cup of coffee, or something much more serious, but the risen Lord loves us so much that he comes alongside us to tap us on the shoulder to remind us he is there. Such is the gift and miracle of Easter. It is the good news that we are not alone, and that as we face life in this world with all its challenges, the risen Lord Jesus takes us by the hand and to lead and guide us. So thank you Dave for reminding me that all I need to today is a little bit of coffee, and a whole lot of Jesus!

At ULC, we are supporters of local efforts to feed hungry people, families, and children. During May, here are some suggestions for food items to share:


May 3 and 7: Canned fruits and vegetables

Blanche Evenson Funds

We recently received our yearly gift from the Blanche Evenson Fund. The total gift was \$7,220. What a wonderful gift! This year the Church Council decided to use those funds to increase our reserve fund, which means we have a reserve fund of \$30,000. Now during shortfalls, we are not depending on other designated funds to cover salaries and bills, unless the shortfall is over \$30,000. Of course, the reserve fund must always be paid back. Thank you, Blanche!





Financial Update

Our general fund shortfall is \$18,109 at the end of March. Soon the beautiful summer months will be here, so we are preparing ourselves for this time where lakes and vacations call us away from Grand Forks, and our income often dips.
