

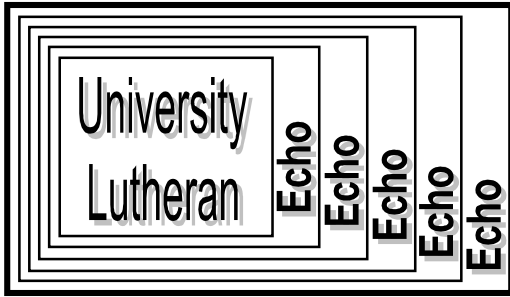

I am sitting at my desk at church on Saturday morning, wondering what I might share with you in this article. It is a dreary day outside, and inside my office I feel somewhat gloomy as well. Our little girl, Erin, who is not so little anymore, 27 years old and married, is moving next week from Billings, Montana to Tahlequah, Oklahoma. Her husband, Parker, has been hired as the assistant baseball coach for the Northeastern State University RiverHawks. Hopefully, it is a great career move for him, and that Erin will find meaningful work teaching or otherwise, as they start this new phase in their lives.

Meanwhile, back in Grand Forks, I am wishing they were moving a little closer to us, instead of farther and farther away. Of course, I am aware these things happen in life, but that doesn't mean that I have to like it. At any rate, I am flying Sunday night to help them load a U-Haul truck and drive their vehicles to Tahlequah, so now I am even participating in the very thing which is making me feel sad today. That is my role as being Dad in this situation, and I would not have it any other way. Even though I will be helping them move farther away, I am also delighted at the opportunity to see them.

It struck me while I am sitting here, how I have very little to feel sad about, even with Erin and Parker moving. In Fargo, a family is in a desperate search for their 22-year-old daughter, Savanna, who was 8 months pregnant. Apparently, someone kidnapped Savanna last Saturday and harvested her baby, and left her to die. Is something so evil even possible? May God help us! Whatever the case, it is true that there are many more terrifying situations in the world, real reasons to worry and feel very sad, when compared to my feelings about Erin and Parker moving to Tahlequah, Oklahoma.

Fortunately, there is light for this dreary and gloomy day. Just two feet in front of my face is a picture drawn by one of our Sunday School students. Hannah Murphy drew it and gave it to me, and now I see it every time I am working at my computer. It is a picture of four snowcapped mountains drawn with crayons. The caption on the picture is, "Faith can move mountains". She also cited the Bible verse which inspired her, Matthew 17:20. Hannah probably doesn't realize it, but she is an artist, theologian, pastor, and preacher, through her picture. It is simple, yet very deep.

The actual verse from Matthew is this, *"For truly I tell you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you."* The context of the verse is that Jesus had just cast out a demon from a little boy, and he was explaining to his disciples how he could do such things. He did not brag, and say that he could do it because he was the Son of God, and can do whatever miracle he chooses. He said that it was faith in God that did it, and which overcomes even the greatest troubles and obstacles in our lives.



Jesus didn't move Mount Rushmore or Mount Everest, nor was he asking his disciples to do that. What would be the purpose of that? Instead, Jesus was using a metaphor here to teach his disciples, and that means us too, that with faith in God, we can get through and even overcome whatever hardships and challenges we face in life. In other words, faith in God can see people through things like flooding in southern Texas, grief over the loss of a daughter in Fargo, treatments for cancer in Grand Forks, as well as the sadness of a daughter and son-in-law moving faraway to new and different place.

Thank you, Hannah, for your enlightening picture, and for your pastoral reminder that through faith in God, we can face all things in life because the Lord is present with us, giving us peace and strength, and guiding us through to better and brighter days. Even dear 22-year old Savanna, if she was murdered and has now died, has hope in the Lord for better and brighter days in heaven. Indeed, as the Lord said to us in Matthew 17:20, nothing is impossible, and all things are possible with God. So, whatever you face now or all fall long, trust in the Lord with all your heart, to save you in every way!

Indeed, the life of a Christian person, a follower of the Lord Jesus Christ, is a life of service. Jesus tells us to love one another, to love our neighbors as ourselves, even to love our enemies. His love for us, his death on the cross, and his resurrection from the dead, are all meant to bless us with salvation, so we can live a life not for ourselves, but for the sake of the people who are around us. To this end, the Lord gives each one of us gifts and talents, so that we might care for those we are called to serve.

Here are some opportunities for us to serve in the next 4 months:

- September: Gifted to serve men and women at the Northlands Rescue Mission

Confirmation Begins!



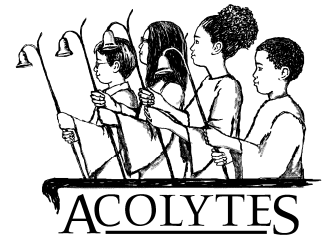
It is indeed that time of year again ... confirmation classes!

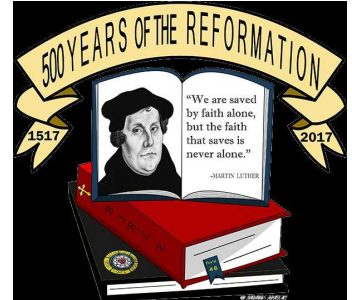

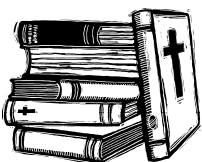
Women of the ELCA: THE APOSTLES' CREED

ULC Financial News

Please Help Us Catch Up!

At the end of July, our general fund shortfall was \$27,321. This means we need some additional help after the slower income months of June, July, and August. In effort to do this, the church council has asked we send a letter and envelope to you, asking you for special help. Please look for this letter in the mail. Thank you for your generosity year-round, and thank you for your extra help at this time.



New Windows Installed

We recently had new windows installed in Jen's, Pastor Tom's, and Heather's offices, as well as the sacristy. Now these windows match the windows we had installed in the lounge and the office workroom a few years ago. This means all windows on the main level of the church have been updated with "no maintenance" and "energy efficient" windows. Thank you for all your contributions to the building fund!

Dreaming for a New Water Fountain

The water fountain in the fellowship hall is old and over the years has given us a few headaches. This summer when the staff (Jen, Heather, Seanne, and Pastor Tom) had a planning meeting at Christus Rex, we noticed they installed a new fountain which was designed to fill water bottles too. These are expensive, but we have put it on a dream list. The cost of the fountain is around \$2,000, and we figure it would cost around \$500 for new plumbing, which we are told, it would require. If you happen to think this is a good idea as well, and would like to contribute to such a building improvement, please contact Jen or Pastor Tom.



Your Mission Endowment Fund Is Working!

The ULC Mission Endowment Fund was set up with the idea that our congregation could have a permanent endowment where we would use the distributions to do mission projects while continuing to grow the fund. Once we reached our initial goal, we started funding projects.

It has been less than six years since your ULC Mission Endowment funded its first project – building a Spring Box for a village in the Central African Republic, which provided clean water for 2000 people. In all we have funded 18 projects with total contributions of \$26,099. At the end of 2011 we had just over \$100,000 in our endowment and this month we just sent in another \$5,600 to bring the endowment total to over \$150,000. It is working just as we had hoped!

The reason the ULC Mission Endowment Fund works is all of you! Our Church Family has been so supportive in remembering this ministry with your gifts especially when attending funerals of our church family. We have had many people remember their loved ones with special donations through the years – some annually. You have generously supported our Music Nights and other fundraising events. There have even been questions on naming the ULC Mission Endowment on an insurance policy or as part of an estate plan. What a grand way to leave a legacy for yourself or a loved one by supporting this wonderful ongoing ministry and touching the lives of people long after you are gone.

Thank you for making the ULC Mission Endowment a reality and a blessing for so many!

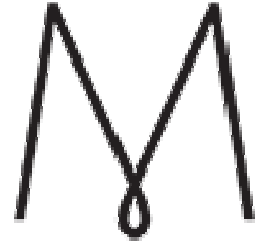

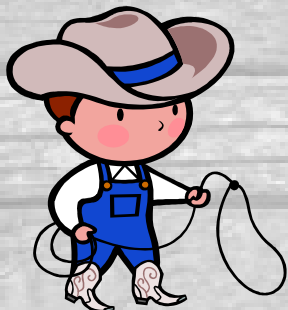

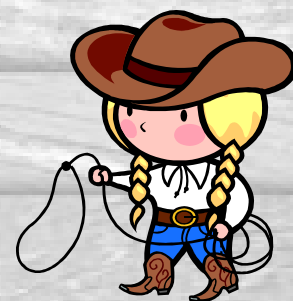
It is the time for our annual fall pig roast!

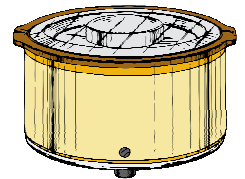
