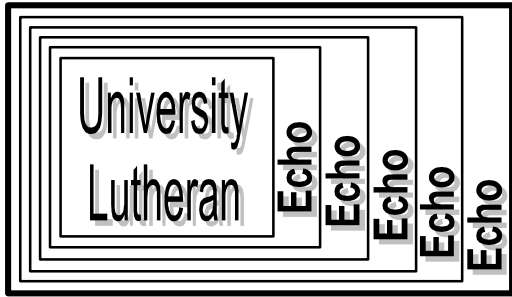

What do you think Jesus' first words were when God raised him from the dead on that very first Easter Sunday morning? Perhaps he said, "Oh my goodness, did I oversleep? Or "Dad, can't I sleep just 10 more minutes?" Or "Where is everyone?" All my silliness aside, the Gospels tell us there was no human person to welcome Jesus back from the dead that first Easter. Mark's Gospel tells us that three women, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, went to the tomb just after sunrise to anoint Jesus' body with burial spices, and not to greet Jesus as their risen Lord.

It seems none of the disciples believed Jesus would be raised from the dead. The longer version of the Gospel of Mark, which is not usually thought to be original to the Gospel, reminds us that none of Jesus' disciples were really expecting him to be raised from the dead. In fact, Mark makes a point of telling us the disciples did not believe it. Verse 11 says, "they would not believe". Verse 13 says, "they did not believe". Verse 14 says, "they had not believed". This is important because now we know the original disciples who knew Jesus personally were not so different from us.

Most of us don't possess a vibrant resurrection faith just because Easter appears on our calendars. Life is too full of hardship and distractions to such faith. This was true even for those who knew Jesus, who spent most days with him, and who even heard him predict his suffering, death, and resurrection. The events of those last days, seeing Judas betray Jesus, witnessing police arrest him, and watching from a distance as he was tried, harassed, beaten, crucified, taunted, dying, dead, and buried, were simply too much for their faith. In their minds, Jesus was dead, and death is always permanent.

However, the Lord just kept coming back. He appeared to Mary and to Peter, he appeared to two people on the road to Emmaus, he appeared to ten more disciples, and he even appeared to a tardy Thomas, who was absent the first time he appeared to the disciples. The Apostle Paul reports Jesus appeared to more than five hundred believers, and then finally on the road to Damascus also appeared to Paul, this time after Jesus had ascended to heaven. It is the risen Lord himself who overcame the disciples lack of faith in the angelic proclamation, "He has been raised; he is not here."

Two thousand years after the fact, people will gather in churches on Easter Sunday 2024 to sing the good news that Jesus Christ is risen today. Like those original disciples who saw, touched, and shared fellowship with the risen Lord, we too count on the Lord himself to overcome our doubts. Therefore, I encourage you to look for the risen Lord Jesus to show himself to you as you read your Bibles, as you say your prayers at home and attend public worship, as you receive the gift of his real presence in Holy Communion, and as you give and receive love to and from people as the church, the body of Christ.

These are places where Jesus has promised to come alongside you and be present in your lives. However, you may discover faith in the resurrection in other important places too. Look for Jesus as the sun rises at the beginning of a new day and darkness gives way to light. Look for Jesus as winter turns into spring and barren trees suddenly have leaves. Look for Jesus in the confidence of a dying man who knows without a doubt where he is going at his time of death. Look for Jesus in the faith of a blind woman who on her deathbed sees a door and knows with all her heart the Lord is on the other side.

Finally, look for Jesus in the struggles and challenges of your life. When sin is haunting you, illness is hurting you, things in life are harming you, or someone you dearly love has died, Jesus has promised to keep coming back to help you and give you hope. In fact, no matter what difficulties you face, Jesus has said, "I will be with you always to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20) and "all things are possible" (Mark 10:27). It is through such words of encouragement and encounters with the risen Jesus that resurrection faith is born, sustained, and thrives. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

The Easter Season



On Christmas, we celebrate the Incarnation – that God became one of us, a human being, at the birth of Jesus. During Lent, we focus on the cross, Jesus’s crucifixion and death.

However, at Easter, we rejoice in the empty tomb and the resurrection of Jesus. Easter is the day Jesus rose from the dead after being crucified and buried in a tomb. When the tomb is empty on Easter morning, we see the risen Jesus has indeed conquered sin and death. Had Jesus not risen from the dead, the world would have seen him as just a prophet or teacher instead of who he is: the Son of God, the Christ.

Jesus’ resurrection is the reason we know his name today. It’s the foundation of all Christianity. With his death and resurrection, Jesus has opened God and heaven to all people. Because of Easter, we know that no matter what sufferings we experience, what sins we struggle with, or what ways we encounter death, God is always with us.

Easter is everything.

The fourth Sunday of Easter is a special week. It is Good Shepherd Sunday. It is the day we gather around Psalm 23 and John 10, and we say, “I just wanna be a sheep!”

Of course, the jewel of the trip is the Youth Gathering in New Orleans on July 16-20. Every coin and dollar given at our Noisy Offering each Sunday and Wednesday will be directed toward this effort.

Feed My Starving Children

Our Greater Grand Forks MobilePack event is April 26-28. We are fundraising to pack meals for hungry children, and in April we pack these meals. This year we will pack over 320,000 meals. Our goal as a community is to raise around \$95,000, and so far we have \$59,947.

So far at ULC, we are fundraising for this service event in these ways:

- **Noisy Offerings** at worship (January, February and March)
- **Lenten Coin folder** money (A quarter a day in Lent)
- **ULC Endowment Fund** awarded FMSC gave a **\$3,000 grant**
- **Chocolate chip cookies** at fellowship was Sunday, March 17



Remember every 25 cents pays for one meal for a hungry child in our world. A generous donation of \$25 provides 100 meals, and \$100 provides 400 meals.

Worship Assistants

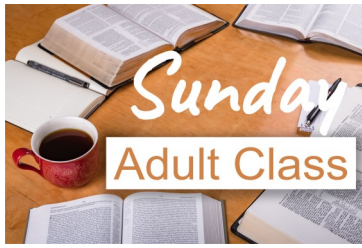

Thank you for all your offerings and contributions to ULC in 2023, and certainly for your ongoing generosity in 2024. At the end of February our general fund balance was **short \$2,867**.



We also are still receiving **High Five Funds**, which means that some people are giving \$5 extra a week to give ULC a "high five" for the ministry we all do here together. It's a little cheesy, but also an effective way to raise a few extra dollars. Last year we raised an extra \$1,450. That's 290 high fives. Could we maybe do more this year? Of course we can!

Things are progressing well. Here are some updates from last month:

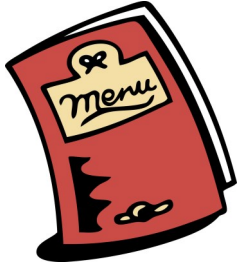

Midweek Lenten services are behind us, but we still have Wednesday worship which is preceded by our Wednesday meals. Here are the Wednesday Meals for April:

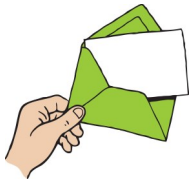

New Business:

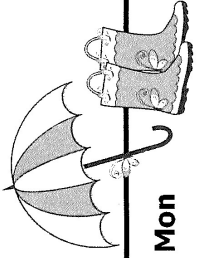
- Summer Bible Camp Scholarships: tabled until next time.
