A bird died in our backyard last week. It was a chipping sparrow, which I easily identified by its characteristic bright chestnut crown, white eyebrow, narrow black eyeline, black beak, and light gray underparts. It was a small, but full-grown bird, about 5 inches tall. Whether or not it was a female of male was not apparent to me. I think they are one of the prettiest sparrows because of their sharp color contrasts. I have not seen too many chipping sparrows in our backyard until this year. They seemed to have moved into the area in large numbers, which has made it fun for me to watch a new bird.

I was sitting in our kitchen when I heard a loud thud. It was not an unfamiliar noise, since this was not the first bird to crash into one of the tall windows on our porch. Usually, they stumble around for a while and fly away. I watched this one out the window and it was not moving at all. After fifteen minutes or so had passed, I went to check on the bird myself. It was most certainly dead. I then wondered if his or her mate had seen what had happened, and if there were baby birds who just lost a parent. Maybe you think its silly for me to wonder about such things, but it's just how my pastor brain works.

Within minutes I was back to whatever I was doing, but my thoughts were on the bird and the brevity and sometimes tragedy of life. How strange to think of how this bird probably had just finished a tasty meal at our bird feeder, took off, did not see that our window was a solid surface, and it perished. Life is like that in the human world too. A dad is driving home from work, and he is in a car accident. A child goes to a doctor's appointment because he hasn't been feeling well and is diagnosed with a terrible disease. An older woman has surgery to repair her heart and never awakens to see her family.

In other words, as a friend of mine used to say, "Life can change on a dime." That was his way of saying that one moment can be happy and good, only to be quickly followed by some kind of hardship that changes everything. For example, I was counseling someone the other day. There had been no death in the family, but there were unexpected relationship struggles that had suddenly surfaced and ended all meaningful communication. It happened so fast, this person was still reeling from it. There was no explanation as to what was wrong, so all that was left for the short run is what we call a broken heart.

Some people would say this is why we need to enjoy the moment. When our health is good, when our families are intact, when our days are happy, we need to appreciate what we have at that time. I think this is true. For instance, when we are with our children and grandchildren, we certainly experience some amazing God-given joyful moments. From where I sit, what is more joyful than giving piggyback and horsey rides to excited grandchildren who are 2, 3, and 5 years old. What is more joyful than holding a recently born beautiful granddaughter who has just entered God's world and our lives.

These are indeed moments we ought to enjoy, even treasure. However, in the midst of a life that can so rapidly change, we still need something more. We need something or someone who does not change and is always there for us. This is the place of God, our Lord Jesus Christ. While it is possible for everything else to change in our lives, God's presence in our lives and God's love for us as children of God never changes. So, when those terrible moments come our way, and we are shaken by whatever happened, we can count on the Lord to be there as promised, to help us, hold us, and keep us safe.



How do we get here from a bird dying in our backyard? I am certain none of us will be flying into a porch window anytime soon! However, the sudden change in this bird's life is a good reason for us to pause and appreciate what is good in our lives at this moment. At the same time, we know life can change so fast, that today is always a good day to say a prayer and thank God for always being there for us. It's a good day to consider how much God loves us, and to be aware how close God is to us even in those hardest moments where we might feel alone. The truth is, thanks be to God, we never are alone.




ULC Adult Education in June
