

What do we treasure above all else? If people would watch us, could they see that we love Jesus more than anything? Consider these two Bible verses: First, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the greatest and first commandment." And second, "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." We speak a lot about how much God loves the world, and we often sing, "Jesus Loves Me", but what might we say about how we love Jesus?

These verses remind us that our first love in life is God. We are to love God with all our heart, all our soul, and all our mind. The second verse focuses us especially on loving Jesus. We are to love Jesus more than our parents, children, and grandchildren. How can we do this? We have such strong feelings of love for our families. Ever since our grandchildren were born, my heart is full of love for Addison, Shae, Thomas, and Jolene. I love them so much, as I do my parents, Margo, Erin, Michael, and yes, even all of you, the people of ULC. How much more room is there in my heart for me to love Jesus?

There is a remarkable story in Luke 7 about Jesus having supper at the home of Simon the Pharisee. While they were having a perfectly respectable dinner, a woman from the city dared to enter into the house and approach Jesus. Apparently, she was a well-known sinner, even a prostitute. She started weeping at the feet of Jesus, bathing his feet with her tears and kissing them, wiping them off with her hair and anointing them with ointment. Simon thought if Jesus were a prophet that he would not let a woman like this touch him in this way. But Jesus knew what was on Simon's mind and asked him a question.

"Simon, if a moneylender forgave two debtors, one who owed him \$5,000 dollars and one who owed him \$50, which one would love him more?" Simon answered, "I suppose the one who owed him more." Then Jesus said to him, "Do you see this woman? When I entered your home, you didn't give me water to wash my feet, and this woman washed my feet with her tears. You offered me no kiss, yet she hasn't stopped kissing my feet. You didn't anoint my head with oil, but she anointed my feet with ointment. Therefore, her sins, though many, are forgiven." So, he said to the woman, "Your sins are forgiven."

Jesus summarized all this in Luke 7:47 by saying, "Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven; hence she has shown great love." It seems this woman heard and believed the Gospel that Jesus loved her. That in truth, Jesus had come into the world to love her and forgive her sins. This so deeply moved her that she showed through her actions that she treasured Jesus more than anything else. While Simon would hardly look at her because of her sin, Jesus saw her face to face, loved her despite her sin, and then did the very thing that horrified Simon the most: He forgave her sin.

I believe this woman was so stunned by the love Jesus had for her that she could not help but to love him back with all her heart, soul, and mind, as well as with all her tears, hair, hands, and lips. This Lent, Holy Week, and Easter let us reflect deeply on this same thing: That Jesus sees us too, face to face, and loves us despite our sin. That in truth, he willingly became a sacrifice for us on the cross. He willingly suffered and was crucified there for us because as he loved this woman and forgave her sin, he loves us and forgives our sin too. Jesus knows we need forgiveness as much as the woman in this story.

As we picture Jesus' suffering and dying for us on the cross, let us believe the Gospel that Jesus loves us. Let us be so stunned by his forgiveness and love that while we proclaim Jesus loves us, that we also show forth in our lives that we treasure and love Jesus more than anything. As easy as it is for us to sing, "Jesus loves me this I know," may it also be easy for us to sing, "O how I love Jesus, because he first loved me." And may we come to understand that our love for God and for Jesus will never diminish but always increase our love for our parents and spouses, children and grandchildren, neighbors and strangers.



- Our **ULC Lenten Devotion Book** to read throughout the season.



ULC Adult Education in March



Sunday Morning Adult Class - "Those Voices in Jesus' Ear"

Who was speaking to or at Jesus during the time of his earthly ministry? You might say that there were a lot of people, and you would be right. Well, we are going to take a look in the Scriptures to identify some of those who Jesus was listening to and how they might have been trying to influence him.

Here are a few examples, and there may be others:

February 22: The Devil
March 1: Family
March 8: Disciples
March 15: Crowds
March 22: Religious Authorities
March 29: Civil Authorities

WELCA Bible Study – March 13: "I AM: God's Holy Name and Promise"

Session one of this study is entitled: "Bread, vine and light: Abiding with us" (John 6, 8 and 15). We begin this session by rooting and grounding ourselves in the story of Moses at the Burning Bush, learning about God's holy name, I AM—a name that holds all of time and space, all that was and all that is and all that will be, past, present and future. From there, we will explore three of Jesus's "I AM" statements: "I am the bread of life;" "I am the true vine," and "I am the light of the world." Each of these declarations bring to mind the ways that God, whose name is "I AM," abides with God's people, providing, nurturing and sustaining us in day-to-day life.

Calling All Men – March 21: "First Peter at a Glance"

Calling All Men is studying First Peter. We sometimes set aside and even forget the two beautiful letters written by one of Jesus' first disciples, the Apostle Peter. Over the next months, we will seek to overcome this tendency by studying portions of First Peter.

During the month of February our topic is "Living Godly Lives". Come see how Peter calls us to live as Christian people in this world. Please join us on Saturday, March 21, at 8:30am in the Fellowship Hall for breakfast pizza, prayer, conversation, and Bible study.

Thursday Morning Study – March 5, 12, 19, and 26: "The Apostle Peter"

We have all read stories about Peter's highs and lows in the Gospels. Now in this 8-week course, we will meet the Apostle Peter through his writings. We have completed First Peter, and now in March we turn to Second Peter. You will meet a more mature Peter who has a wonderful sense for the Gospel and is willing to be imprisoned and die for it. Here Peter demonstrates what it means to be a follower of Jesus. Join us at 9:30am in the Fellowship Hall.

Paul and Bonnie Cox Scholarship

We are now receiving applications for our sixth annual Paul and Bonnie Cox Scholarships. These scholarships are awarded to any person seeking any sort of post-secondary education. The deadline for applications is May 1. We hope to offer 2 \$500 scholarships at least, although some years we have awarded a few more. Applications are available in the church office and will eventually be mailed out to our 12th grade students. The scholarship committee will meet and hope to have an announcement to be made by June 1.



Confirmation in March



The Lenten season is a little tricky when it comes to confirmation, so please take a careful look at the schedule at hand:

CONFIRMATION LENT PACKS are to be completed each Wednesday in Lent at our 6:00pm worship service between now and March 25 – both Wednesday and Sunday students.

OUR MENTOR PROGRAM begins Wednesday, February 25. Students in grades 7-9 should pick out a faith mentor and bring them and at least one parent to our faith mentor orientation meeting that evening at 7:15pm in the fellowship hall. Yes, 8th and 9th grade students, you may use the same mentor as before. That is actually perfect!

With the Lent packs and mentor program, **there are no regular confirmation classes during Lent.** After Easter, Wednesday classes resume on April 8, and Sunday classes on April 12.

We are hosting the Grand Forks Conference Assembly this year. The significance of this is that our synod is electing a bishop. Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth IS eligible and running for a second and final 6-year term, but nevertheless, we have an election process to complete. At our assembly we can forward up to 7 bishop candidates, including Bishop Tessa.

You may attend this meeting but not everyone may vote. These people are eligible to vote:

1. All ministers of Word and Sacrament and ministers of Word and Service serving under call in the conference.
2. All members of the congregational councils or their designee (as appointed by the council).
3. Officers of the conference.
4. Synod Authorized Ministers serving under contract in the conference.
5. Members elected by the assembly to churchwide or synod boards who reside in the conference.
6. Chairpersons of the conference women's, men's and youth auxiliaries, if any.

As it says above, this meeting will take place at ULC on Sunday, March 22, at 2:00pm in our fellowship hall. We also will be providing refreshments for this meeting.

Feed My Starving Children Mission of the Month



During January, February, and March, ULC is raising funds for our community's FMSC MobilePack event on April 23-25. Our Mission Endowment has already set aside \$3,000, and we will designate our Noisy Offerings in January through March for our FMSC packing event as well. The January Noisy Offering total was \$630.08. Thank you!


It is our goal as a community to pack 400,000 meals, and we have already raised \$64,369 of the \$117,500 that we need to pay for the event. Each 29 cents raised provides a meal for a hungry child. That means a gift of \$30 pays for 103 meals, a gift of \$50 pays for 172 meals, and a gift of \$100 pays for 344 meals. What a wonderful way to serve hungry children!

Fun fact: Did you know that Feed My Starving Children has provided 4,986,714,250 meals to date to hungry and starving children throughout the world.
