

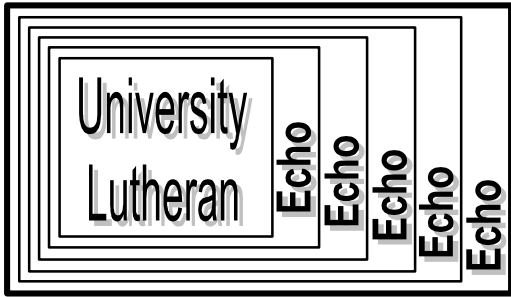

Walking along the beach in Costa Rica this January, I was intrigued by all the beautiful seashells washed ashore after high tide. It was my wish to take a few home with me, but I was told it was illegal to remove them from the country, and that if they even find one shell in your luggage, it would be taken away by the Costa Rican officials. What I secretly wished to find, however, was a sand dollar. When they are alive, they are either gray or beige and should be thrown back into the ocean, but if they are the more familiar white, they are really fun to collect. If I had found one, I would have wished to take it home.

I am intrigued by the sand dollar because God may have placed his signature on both sides of this special beach treasure. Why do I say this? Well, if you have one at home you can see the legend of the sand dollar for yourself. All the markings tell the story of Jesus – the Gospel! Each sand dollar includes a Christmas poinsettia and a star celebrating the birth of Jesus, five pierced holes representing the five wounds of the crucified Christ, an Easter lily celebrating the resurrection of Jesus, and if broken open, inside the sand dollar there are five tiny pieces which resemble small doves – the Holy Spirit.

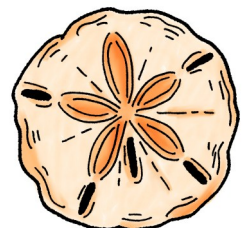
Some people of course would doubt God did this and call the whole legend ridiculous and a coincidence. But I like to think of God in the beginning quietly and with a huge smile creating the sand dollar on the fifth day of creation. Might God have intentionally and joyfully foretold the coming of his Son, our risen Savior, on this tiny, humble creature of the sea? After all, who is more humble than the Lord himself, who quietly suffered crucifixion and death on the cross to save us from sin, evil, and death? Was Jesus humbly predicting his resurrection when he said, “those who humble themselves will be exalted”?

Of course, the most important signature of God in the world is not the sand dollar. It is instead our risen Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ. In this case, we cannot pick him up like a sand dollar and show him off to other people, because this signature of God is not found along ocean shores or even on mountaintops. This signature of God is found deep within the people who believe in him – inside our very hearts. A very famous Easter song, “He Lives,” written by Alfred Henry Ackley, speaks of the resurrection of our Lord and puts it this way. “You ask me how I know He lives; He lives with in my heart.”

Ackley wrote “He Lives” in 1933 in response to two encounters. First, he was posed a question by a young Jewish man about why Christians worship Jesus, a dead Jew. Second, on Easter Sunday the same year, he heard a preacher on the radio say that everything Jesus taught was true, even if he was still in his tomb and wasn’t raised from the dead. So, in order to address both situations, Ackley wrote the hymn to assert that Jesus Christ is indeed alive, living within the hearts of those believe in him, and encouraging Christians everywhere through personal experience and scripture to believe in the risen Lord.

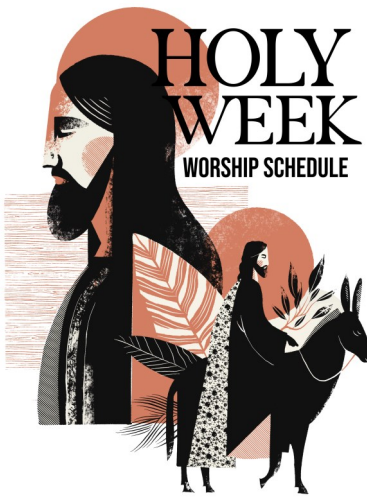
Don’t we all wish we could hear words of an angel, as did the women who went early to the tomb that first Easter morning: “Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised.” Don’t we all wish we could hear words of Jesus himself, as did the frightened disciples in a locked room: “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” But then again, I believe through Scripture, prayer, personal experience, and faith, we have heard such words, and we know that as the Apostle Paul says in Ephesians 3:17 – that Christ dwells in our hearts through faith.

Whether or not the sand dollar is a signature of Almighty God on the creation is not crucial for me. While its markings seem like more than a coincidence, it is the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ that is the real signature of God in the hearts of his people. Right there in your own heart, your own soul, within your very life, God has placed a permanent signature – the risen Lord. Perhaps if you could see him, he would say, “I am here. You are forgiven. I am with you every day of your lives. You have a place prepared by me in heaven. I love you. Your Savior, Jesus.” That’s way better than the sand dollar!

Our Greater Grand Forks MobilePack event is April 23-25. We are fundraising to pack meals for hungry children, and in April we pack these meals. This year we will pack over 400,000 meals. Our goal as a community is to raise around \$117,500 and so far, we have \$70,544.



So far at ULC, we are fundraising for this service event in these ways:

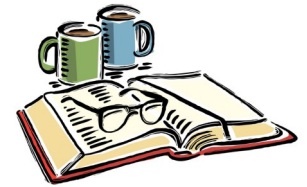
- **Noisy Offerings** in January (\$630.08), February (\$688.31) and March (\$984 so far)
- **ULC Endowment Fund** awarded FMSC a **\$3,000 grant**

Remember every 29 cents pays for one meal for a hungry child in our world. A generous gift of \$30 pays for 103 meals, a gift of \$50 pays for 172 meals, and a gift of \$100 pays for 344 meals. What a wonderful way to serve hungry children!

Paul and Bonnie Cox Scholarship

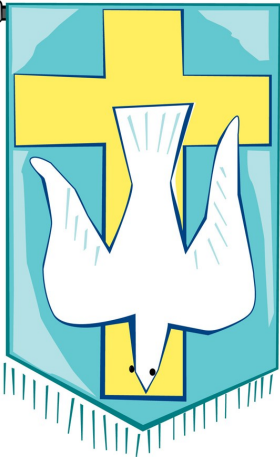

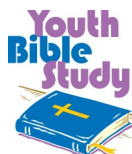


Sundaes on Wednesdays

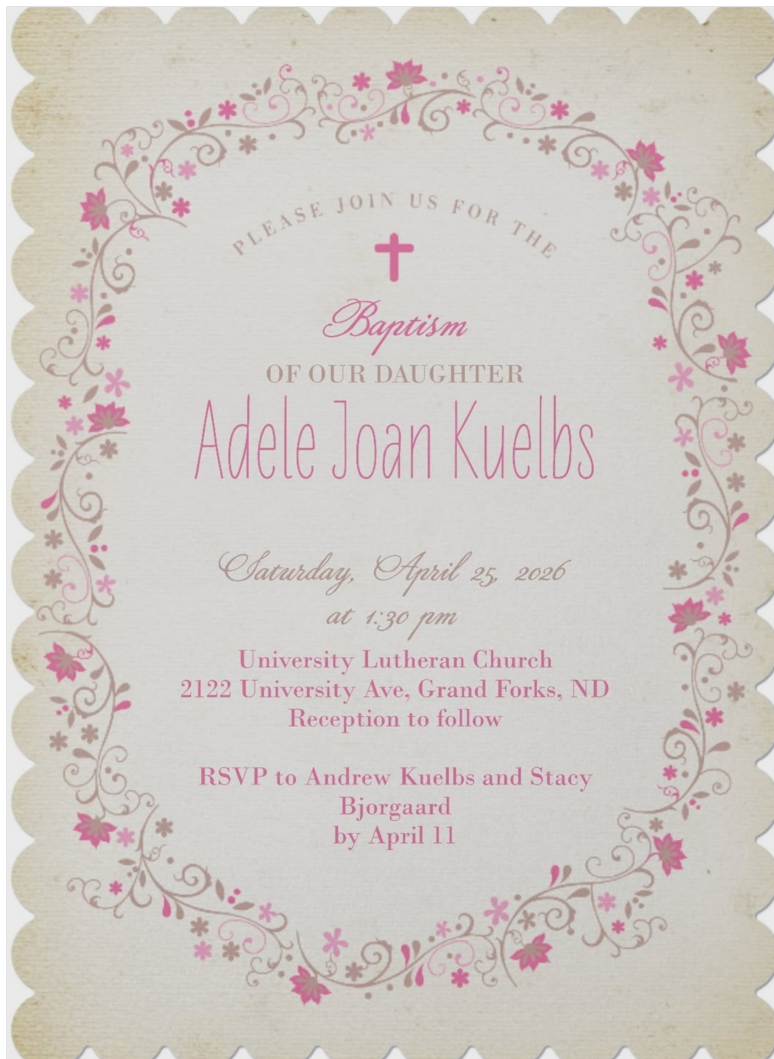
Financial News

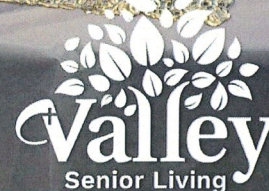
