

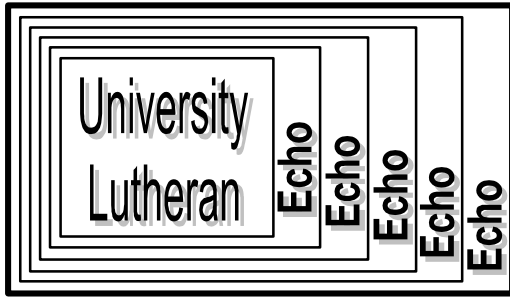

The season of the resurrection, Easter, concludes the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, with the great festival of Pentecost. The Day of Pentecost is a celebration of coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. Possibly in the same room where Jesus washed their feet, where they celebrated the Passover meal with Jesus and had their First Communion, where they first saw Jesus risen from the dead, the disciples received the Holy Spirit just as Jesus promised. Acts 2:3 says that the Spirit came with the sound of a mighty rushing wind, and that tongues of fire rested on each of them.

The disciples then spoke other languages as the Holy Spirit gave them ability, so that all the people in Jerusalem who were there celebrating the Harvest Festival, could hear the disciples speak about the life, crucifixion, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. For Christians this marks the beginning of the Church, as Acts 2:41 says that about 3,000 people became believers in that Lord that day. Now as Jesus promised, the disciples experienced the Holy Spirit in a new and wonderful way, which empowered them to share the Gospel with others and trust that indeed the Lord was always with them.

However, chances are you have not experienced the Holy Spirit coming to you with the sound of a mighty wind. You probably haven't experienced tongues of fire dancing on your head. You probably haven't miraculously spoken in other languages you have never even studied. Well, neither have I! Yet we believe the Holy Spirit still has managed to come to us. John 20 offers us another look at Pentecost. It is a quieter Pentecost, but no less important. It shows us that the Holy Spirit comes to us in a variety of ways, often quieter and less dramatic than what happened on the more famous Day of Pentecost.

This story took place on the evening of Jesus' resurrection, fifty days before the tongues of fire. The door is locked and the disciples are trying to figure out what to do now Jesus is dead. They are lost, confused, scared, and definitely not looking for a Pentecost miracle. Then Jesus came and stood among them. He offered them peace and he breathed on them, saying: "Receive the Holy Spirit." Finally, he sent them out of that room on a mission, saying: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." It's another Pentecost moment, quieter to be sure, when the Holy Spirit is given to the disciples.

I suspect for many of us, this is closer to how we experience the Holy Spirit. God often comes to us in an hour of need, when we are lost, scared, and confused. Here the Holy Spirit comes to us differently, in a still, small voice, quietly offering the gift of peace in an anxious moment. The truth is that Jesus comes to us through the Holy Spirit, often when we need him most, and not always in loud and obvious ways. It is often quiet and subtle. Maybe through a note from a friend, a song we hear, a coincidence we know is no coincidence, a Scripture passage we come across that is just what we need to hear.

It is such quiet and subtle moments that tell us the Holy Spirit is active in our lives, and that the Lord really is always with us. Did you know your first Pentecost moment was very likely your baptism? I received the gift of the Holy Spirit when I was just under six months old at my baptism. I don't remember it, but I know it's true. It's true for all of us. Every baptism is a miracle, because every baptism represents a Pentecost moment, when we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit, as we are baptized into Jesus Christ. Remember to learn the day of your baptism and celebrate the day you received the Holy Spirit.



So, come back with me to the moment when Jesus breathed on the disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit. Remember that he also said, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." These amazing words are among those which inspired me to enroll in seminary. Here we see that Jesus gives us the Holy Spirit so that we might carry on his mission in the world. In other words, we are given the Holy Spirit to be witnesses of God's love and the Gospel of Jesus Christ in our community, and we are given the Holy Spirit to love our neighbors near and far away, helping and serving them with whatever need.

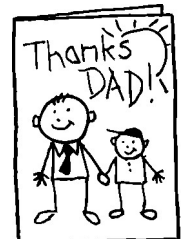


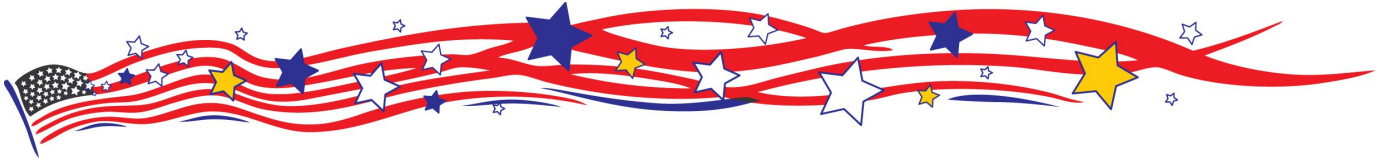
Worship on Synod Assembly Weekend – June 7

For the month of June, we will study some questions that maybe you have thought of before, or maybe you haven't. These are four single session Bible studies:

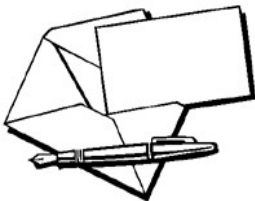
- June 4: Is Your Dog's Life More Valuable Than a Stranger's?

The ULC Visitation Team will meet **Friday, June 19, at 1:00 pm** in the narthex to write cards to our homebound and nursing home members. Please join us!



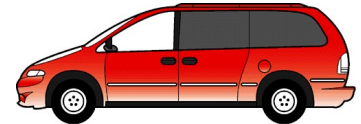


Mission of the Month – Love in Action

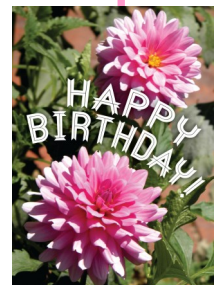
Donation Table in the Narthex

Summer Musical

The characters in the musical are based on actual Gander residents and the stranded travelers, dubbed "come from aways", they housed and fed. It is an incredible, true story of how tragedy begets human kindness, how generosity towards others makes a real difference in times of crisis, and how hope emerges amidst the world's darkest times.
